DE. CO, which is short for Delaware Collective, will serve as an incubator for both established and upcoming chefs in the city. The \$3.5 million project opens this year at the DuPont Building and will feature eight kitchens and a central bar.

A graduate of International Economics at Middlebury College, Peter worked for a startup in Baltimore as part of Venture for America. He then spent two years working for an electronic materials startup and assorted restaurant jobs prior to landing his role at Seawall Development.

The Mill is Peter DiPrinzo's home base in Wilmington. He says, "After an early ride up or a day of meetings I can hide out and get some work done, or meet other members around the kitchen. I want to get everyone excited about the food hall, and get their feedback on our design and food options!"
