Preparing for Delmarva Disaster Relief

Larry was born in Anchorage, Alaska. He has lived in Delaware since 1965, attending: Dover High School; the University of Delaware; and Delaware Law School (now know as Widener University School of Law). Larry served as a Military Policeman for the united States Army in between college and law school. After law school Larry served as the Clerk of the Court for New Castle County Family Court, and then as a Staff Attorney for New Castle County Superior Court. Larry opened his own law firm in 1992 where he practiced until he joined Ferry Joseph PA in 2008 as Of Counsel. Since 1992 Larry formed, operated and then sold several commercial enterprises; served as a judge at Newark’s City court; and then later began activities in non-profit organizations. Non-profit experienced beginning early, perhaps in 1972, Larry was a charter member of Delaware Youth for the Handicapped. He carried the spirit of service with him until he was able to allocate more time. He formed The Commodore Center, as a non-profit disaster relief organization in Saint Georges, and shortly thereafter joined Delaware Voad through that organization. Larry served as Treasurer for several years until he was elected as State Chairman of Delaware Voad in January of 2018.
